




Foreword


The School







Later in October they were the guests of the Senior Class at a skate, enjoying with their hosts a perfect evening. Another party was held in May, as a climax to the year.





Our G.O.S. continued in its program of social service work and promotion of better fellowship among the girls of the school.


More girls and boys in sports has been the aim of the "K" Club, while the F. F. A. participated with other schools in judging meets.






"Wait a minute, Jill, what's all that chattering coming from the auditorium? Sounds like about a hundred girls having a regular cat session."

"What kind of work have they been doing?"



Activities


