
Homecoming

















Spring came, and the pep squad practiced har for both McClane and Reedley competition.


Money raising projects included ribbon selling a Beggar's Day and sponsoring a dance in the spring.




During the contest season, the band maintained its high performance level by winning their 7th consecutive Superior rating at the C.M.E.A. Festival.




The Madrigals are a highly selected vocal group who perform throughout the valley each year. Competition for membership is stiff and members feel it is a privilege to be selected.






































Seniors


The class of '72, continuing with practices they set down as Freshmen and Sophomores, were spirited and hardworking.

During the year, several members of the club visited numerous businesses throughout Kingsburg to learn about the city itself and to stimulate good will among the merchants toward FBLA.







Each year the Candy Stripers make homemade candy which they sell at the Kingsburg Auxiliary Dinner in order to raise funds for a scholarship.









Girls' Athletic Association

Art Services won the school wide contest for the "best decorated trash barrel" with a "pop art" design of a Campbell's Tomato Soup Can.







The Vikings have the potential and the skills to bring the 1971 C.S.L. Championship back to K.H.S. in a long while.









Chess Club
